



# TRAINING VOCABULARY @ DOG'S DAY OUT

This list is a collection of the specific vocabulary we use at DDO to ensure that there is a consistent form of communication between our staff and all the dogs under our care. We have included our main terminology, which we try to use consistently with all the dogs in our care. This helps to form a more unified, relaxed and happy group. We have included our list as you may find it helpful to integrate these commands at home.

<b>HERE</b>	Stop what the dog is doing and is to come to the human
<b>SIT</b>	To sit bottom on the floor
<b>WAIT</b>	To wait where the dog has been given the command until a release has been given
<b>OKAY</b>	Release word - used to free the dog from another command
<b>GENTLE</b>	Not to snatch from the human (food, toys etc.)
<b>LEAVE IT</b>	Whatever the dog's nose is in is to be left alone and they are to leave the object
<b>FEET OFF</b>	The dog is to get their feet off whatever they are on and have all 4 feet on the ground
<b>CRATE</b>	Dog is to enter the dog crate calmly
<b>BREAK</b>	Dog's will stop playing and concentrate on Staff Member
